


# Message from 1199SEIU United Healthcare Workers East



# The 1199SEIU League Nurse of Distinction Program





**Clare E. Thompson, RN,** is Vice President and Area Director of the 1199SEIU Registered Nurses Division. A Registered Nurse since 1974, she has also been a Registered Midwife since 1976.

Tonight marks the sixth year that she has co-hosted the annual Nurse of Distinction Awards Dinner. Ms. Thompson has served on the staff of 1199SEIU for the past 20 years as a strong advocate for the nursing profession. To this end, she has pursued the right to dignity, respect, and a better quality of work life for our nurses.

Ms. Thompson has consistently struggled to obtain fair contracts for our 1199SEIU nurses—contracts that have provided favorable wages, benefits, training opportunities, and also addressed their staffing recruitment and retention needs.

Her concern for enhancing staffing levels remains a focus in all her institutions, and she has worked on numerous Labor/Management collaborative initiatives. Ms. Thompson also serves as a Union trustee for the RN Training and Job Security Fund, the RN Training and Upgrading Fund, the Child Care Fund and the 1199SEIU Health Care Employees Pension Fund.

Ms. Thompson oversees Team A of the 1199SEIU League of Registered Nurses Division, which represents nurses in Brooklyn, Queens, Manhattan, Staten Island and parts of Long Island.

Consulting, Inc., has worked closely with the League of Voluntary Hospitals and Homes of New York for a number of years. He has assisted Tom Helfrich, Senior Vice President and Counsel to the League, in negotiations with the 1199SEIU Registered Nurses for the last four rounds of collective bargaining. Mr. Linn has also participated in all of the RN labor-management projects that 1199SEIU and LVHH have jointly developed, and he firmly believes in the cooperative, interest-based approach that the parties have employed so successfully in their labor-management relations.

Mr. Linn has co-hosted the Nurse of Distinction
Awards Dinner with Clare Thompson since
2004. He is proud and thrilled to have
been invited back with Clare to co-host this
spectacular and important dinner honoring
New York's best nurses.

The Nurse of Distinction award program was established by the collective bargaining agreement between the 1199SEIU RN Division and the League of Voluntary Hospitals and Homes to recognize nurses who have made a difference in their profession. This program addresses the retention of nurses working at the bedside.

A joint committee of appointed 1199SEIU RN and League members oversees the program. The committee develops the criteria for the awards, solicits nominations from institutions and interviews the nominees.

Tonight, we will present five awards that recognize excellence in practice by both Registered Nurses and managers who work in 1199SEIU hospitals and nursing homes.

The award categories are:

- Nurse of Distinction of the Year (hospital setting)
- Nurse of Distinction of the Year (nursing home setting)
- Nurse Leader of the Year (hospital setting)
- Novice Nurse of the Year
- Nurse Preceptor of the Year

The two Nurse of Distinction awards are peer-nominated categories, while staff RNs from each institution nominated the Nurse Leaders. Tonight, we honor all the nominees as representatives of professional excellence in their institutions.

# 1199SEIU Training and Employment Funds

The 1199SEIU Training and Employment Funds are a joint effort of 1199SEIU and its contributing employers. Our mission is to develop high-quality training, placement and labor-management initiatives that strengthen both the quality of care and our industry as a whole. By providing healthcare workers with educational opportunities, we give them the support they need to effectively provide efficient and caring service. And by working closely with the Union and employers, we help labor and management to solve difficult issues and create innovative solutions together. Through our collaborative work, we intend to create a world-class health-care workforce and service delivery system.

In these difficult times for healthcare workers, the Job Security Fund works with laid-off workers to assist them. The Fund not only assures the extension of their benefits beyond their lay-off dates, but helps them find new employment in member institutions. 1199SEIU members are given a skills assessment and provided training where indicated. The upgrading of skills allows laid-off workers to fill open positions for which they previously would not have qualified.

The 1199SEIU Training and Education Funds offer a full range of professional programs that help RNs stay on the cutting edge of their abilities so they are ready to meet the needs of their employers and the industry. To help address the nursing shortage, the 1199SEIU Training and Employment Funds established the following Funds:

#### **Registered Nurse Training and Job Security Fund (RNTJSF)**

#### Addressing the Nursing Shortage

To recruit new nurses into the profession, a "fast-track" program was created for healthcare workers interested in becoming RNs. And to motivate members' children enrolled in RN programs, the Fund offers tuition assistance. In 2008, almost 300 students completed RN programs with assistance from the Fund.

To help RNs who are eligible for the Training and Upgrading Fund pursue a Bachelor's (BSN) or Master's degree (MSN), the Fund offers tuition reimbursement and academic and counseling support. Study programs are geared toward providing returning adult students with families with flexible study options. For RNs seeking to advance their clinical and on-the-job skills, the Fund offers ongoing high-quality training from specialty review classes to computer classes. In 2008, 345 nurses took the opportunity to study through these degree programs.

# Retaining New Nurses With the New RN Initiative and Mentoring Program

Another nursing shortage issue is retaining new nurses, many of whom are leaving the profession within two years. The New RN Initiative and Mentoring Program helps new nurses with the emotional and clinical challenges they face, connecting them with a nurse mentor and providing them with opportunities to succeed in areas they enjoy. Since 2006, over 800 RNs have participated in this program.

The RNTJSF offers seminars and specialty courses at its training center and at individual institutions; participants are eligible for Continuing Education Units.

#### Labor Management Initiatives, Inc. (LMI)

Improving Care and Job Satisfaction Through Labor Management Initiatives, Inc.

The RN Recruitment and Retention Programs support nurses in their day-to-day work, giving them the opportunity to work with management and positively affect their work environment. The outcome of such projects leads to improved patient and staff satisfaction, which in turn produces high-quality care and RN job satisfaction.
